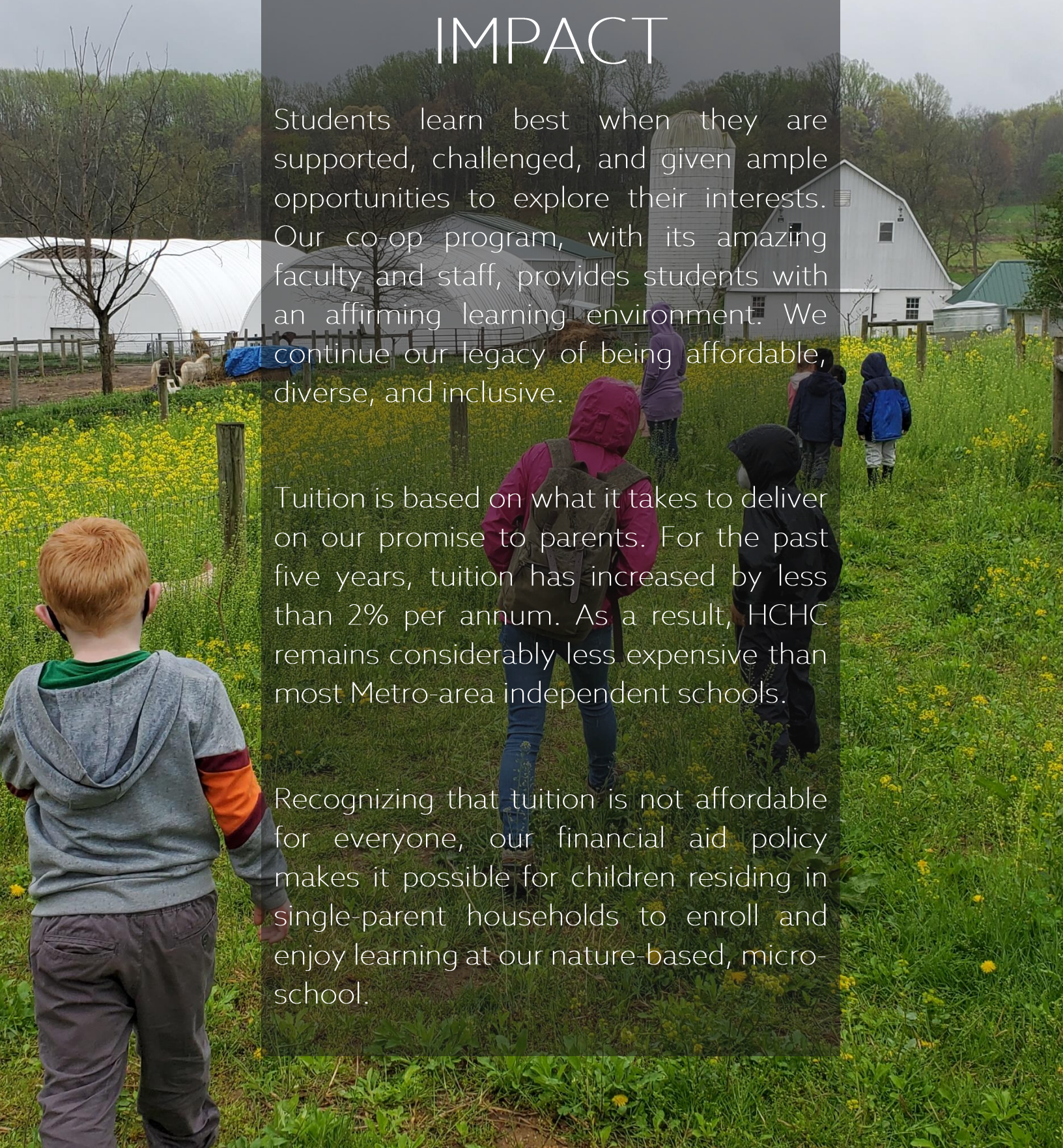

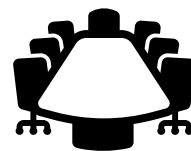
COMMUNITY IMPACT

Students learn best when they are supported, challenged, and given ample opportunities to explore their interests. Our co-op program, with its amazing faculty and staff, provides students with an affirming learning environment. We continue our legacy of being affordable, diverse, and inclusive.

Tuition is based on what it takes to deliver on our promise to parents. For the past five years, tuition has increased by less than 2% per annum. As a result, HCHC remains considerably less expensive than most Metro-area independent schools.

Recognizing that tuition is not affordable for everyone, our financial aid policy makes it possible for children residing in single-parent households to enroll and enjoy learning at our nature-based, micro-school.

Should I apply for financial aid?

Families should complete the financial aid process if they feel that the full cost of tuition is more than they can afford. HCHC has an extremely limited financial aid budget. We may not be able to provide financial aid grants to all qualified applicants.

How are financial aid grants awarded?

Financial aid grants are awarded based on need, which is defined as the difference between the actual cost of a year's tuition and what a family can realistically expect to pay towards that cost.

Who receives financial aid?

Ninety percent (90%) of grants are awarded to single-parent head of households and residents of Baltimore County, Baltimore City, and the District of Columbia.

When am I notified about the decision?

Families will receive written notification of the financial aid decision within 2-3 weeks of applying.

RETURNING FAMILIES

Remit the Extended Tuition Request Form in order to refinance tuition costs and added academic expenses.

Remit the Grant Request Form in order to be considered eligible to receive financial aid.

SUBMIT TAX RETURNS

Submit your most recent tax return to Admissions Dept.

AWAIT DECISION

A decision will be sent to you via DocuSign within 2-weeks of application.



YOU CAN AFFORD ENRICHMENT COURSES AT HCHC!

DID YOU KNOW? Ten percent (10%) of HCHC families receive financial assistance; making an HCHC supplemental education very affordable for homeschoolers. We utilize donations from corporate and private donors to fund our financial aid program.

These funds support our diverse student body and make our independent school affordable to those who qualify. The following are available resources in addition to the Grant Program.

HCHC Referral Program

Our greatest asset are co-op families. We appreciate members who spread the word about HCHC. The Referral Program rewards members with a \$58 Family Credit each time a new family enrolls at HCHC's Leadership Academy.

Tuition Payment Plan

DETAILS: Make an initial \$250.00 - \$350.00 deposit and agree to a 12 to 24-month installment plan. \$15 Registration Fee, \$15 Payment Plan Fee, and 1% Convenience Fee applies.

NOTE: Students with a tuition balance of < \$500.00 are eligible to re-enroll. Students should refrain from attending Co-op if their account is delinquent or in collections status.

Donate to help raise \$50,000.00 for the hardest-hit families who could use a little help from a good Samaritan.



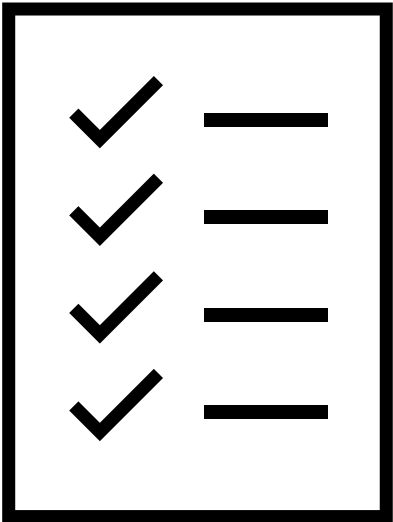
HCHC is not able to forgive unpaid tuition. When families default on payments, students are ineligible to attend.
