Co-op is a year-long commitment and attendance matters. While we do not enforce or penalize student tardiness and excessive absenteeism, we do ask that families arrive on time and give written and/or verbal notice when there is an expected or unexpected absence. Tuition is not refunded, pro-rated, or reimbursed for tardiness or absences.

of 12 | Cell Phone Policy

We understand parents' desire to stay in touch with their children. And while we permit students to bring cell phones on campus, the device must be housed in the student's backpack. Cell phones must not be present or out in the open during class, unless otherwise instructed by the teacher. Students are permitted to make use of their phones only during lunch and recess. However, we ask that students refrain from using apps like Tik Tok and YouTube. Other electronic gadgets such as personal laptops and tablets are welcome in the classroom when used for learning purposes.

of 12 | Bullying Policy

HCHC takes a hard stance against bullying, which includes physical, verbal, and cyber bullying. Unless noted otherwise (based on the degree of harm caused by the assault), first offense students must meet with Head of School for a mandatory parent/teacher meeting. A second incident warrants an automatic 2–4-week suspension. An additional infraction is grounds for immediate expulsion from the program. Tuition is not refunded, pro-rated, or reimbursed when students are suspended or expelled.

of 12 | Fighting Policy

While conflict among students happens, it should never get physical. Students involved in any physical altercation will be expelled from the program and asked to leave the premises immediately. Tuition is not refunded, pro-rated, or reimbursed when students are expelled.

Physical Altercation - a physical confrontation or physical aggression that may or may not result in injury. Physical altercations involve the use of force or violence including (but not limited to) kicking, punching, scratching, spitting, biting, slapping, pushing, or pulling of hair.

08 of 12 | Student Search and Seizure

Policy

While we respect each student's right to privacy, HCHC reserves the right to search through a student's backpack and/or other personal effects if there is probable cause to believe the student is in possession of something illegal and/or harmful such as illicit drugs, a firearm, matches, or pornography. If a student is found in possession of any such items, they will be expelled from the program. Tuition is not refunded, pro-rated, or reimbursed when students are expelled.

of 12 | Health & Wellness Policy

When attending co-op, please make certain your child does not have a yellow or green mucus filled runny nose, acute cough, or high fever. Please help us lower the spread of contagious viruses, by erring on the side of caution and staying home until your child is healthier. Staff may ask sneezing and/or coughing students to wear masks indoors.

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of 12 | Drop-Off Policy

Each family is expected to sign their child(ren) in and out of school upon arrival and departure. HCHC will not release a student to any adult who is not either the parent/guardian or an adult on the approved list set by parents at the time of enrollment. Parents who arrive after 2:15pm to collect their child(ren) are subject to a \$35.00-dollar late fee. Please pick students up on time.

of 12 | Substitute Teacher Policy

Instructors are responsible for securing their own substitute teachers during times of absence, sickness, and/or vacation. When possible, please give Head of School a minimum of 24-hour notice. It's most convenient and easy to select a substitute from HCHC's current faculty.

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of 12 | Class Dismissal Policy

[IN-PERSON] Never dismiss students early from class. Instead, dismiss your class at the top of the hour. If your teaching session ends early, maintain students in your classroom in an orderly fashion under your direct supervision until a timely dismissal. This policy is in effect to decrease the amount of idle time allotted to students in between classes.
