**Class Description:** The Music Theory course is designed to enhance music skills and basic music fundamentals. The essential aspects of melody, harmony, rhythm, and form are studied. Percussion instruments, guitar, and keyboard used primarily.

**Class Description:** This course imparts vital skills like financial literacy, critical thinking, analytical skills, and decision-making. Introducing economic concepts at an early age lays a foundation for responsible financial behavior and nurtures a mindset of resourcefulness and entrepreneurship.

**Class Description:** Odyssey of the Mind is an international program which teaches creative problem solving, teamwork, and performance skills in an environment of fun competition. Through a sharp focus on science, technology, engineering, art, and math (STEAM), students work on a hands-on group project, developing problem solving skills, encouraging teamwork, and sportsmanship. Students compete in an annual state tournament to solve long-term problems and spontaneous problems.

**Class Description:** This course engages students using a designated workbook. Group study during in-person instruction helps student build Spanish fluency through engaging and fun hands-on activities. Topics covered include the alphabet, pronunciation, conversational language, greetings, grammar, conjugation, prepositions, possessives, negation, infinitives, and imperatives.

**Intermediate Spanish:** Student must have 1 year of prior Spanish instruction.

**Class Description:** This class teaches students the basics of chess. Students learn the fundamentals of the game and work on improving their concentration and strategic thinking. Students learn fast decision-making skills, evaluate alternatives, and learn multiple ways to win through guided instruction and opportunities to play other opponents.

**Class Description:** Students are taught by an acting coach with credits in the industry. Rehearsal times (60-mins.) include acting instruction, script writing, improvisation. Some students have the pleasure of participating in the annual Odyssey of the Mind State Tournament and/or end-of-year theatrical performance.

Racial discrimination and sensitive topics will be addressed through discussion and questions. Parents are welcome to tune into the conversation. Students are expected to complete pages in a workbook for class assignments and hands-on projects (e.g., baking, skits, etc.) Final class involves watching the film.</p>
